A CQC inspection is a regulatory assessment conducted by the Care Quality Commission to ensure that health and social care providers in England meet essential standards of quality and safety.

The Care Quality Commission (CQC) is responsible for regulating health and social care services in England. The primary purpose of CQC inspections is to ensure that care providers deliver safe, effective, caring, responsive, and well-led services. Inspections help to identify areas for improvement and ensure compliance with regulatory standards.

Caroline Prentice is in the process of making sure that all areas of The De Parys Group business are compliant, or as near as can be.

How can you help?

- Familiarise yourself with where the Business Continuity Plan is kept.
- Know who the Safeguarding Leads are and what the safeguarding process is.
